We find it hard to believe that so much has been crammed into the two and a bit months since Positive Money NZ was officially launched on the 17th October.

Items of note have been:

- speaking at the “Occupy Wellington” site.

- Local Government New Zealand at the same time that we mail out to the mayors – letting them know of debt free money.
